As we reflect on 2022, one word comes to mind – increase. In 2022 we saw an increase in many areas at Christ's Haven for Children. Our neighborhood of homes remained at capacity over the course of the year. It is incredible to continue to be able to meet the needs of families across the region when they need us most.

Our intake calls for placement of children increased by 15%. With our newly formed Family Resource Center, we are now positioned to serve even more children and families through meal boxes, counseling services, parent and caregiver education, and referrals to equip their family to stay together. Through this new program alone we were able to support 385 families in 2022.

The ability to continue to increase our service area and reach with families is only made possible by the increase in support from our community of volunteers, donors, businesses, churches, and individuals who come alongside us loyally every year.

I am so honored to sit in this seat and see the abundance and increase in what Christ's Haven is able to do each year. I believe that we are just getting started in what we will see continue to grow and develop on our campus, an opportunity to step in and serve families where they are and when they need us most and I feel confident that our community will continue to grow with us to provide as you have for 68+ years. I hope that as you read through the pages of this Annual Report, you are as blessed as I am to see the abundance of growth in our children, families, and programs. Because of our supporters, the families and youth we serve are thriving and can rest secure in the hope of a brighter tomorrow.

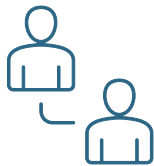
In our first full year of utilizing this assessment tool, 75% of teens showed an increase in their functional areas.

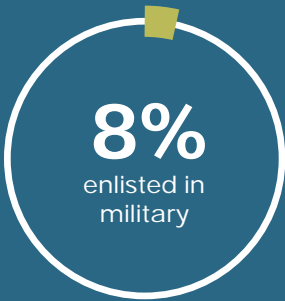
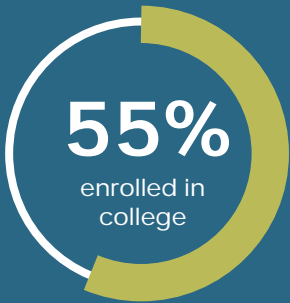

Professional Meet & Greet

We launched a brand new event in 2022 where the teenagers & young adults living at Christ's Haven had the opportunity to meet and learn from 30 professionals from a variety of industries and backgrounds.



29th Annual Golf Classic

We brought this annual event back to the Keller area in 2022 at the Sky Creek Ranch Golf Club and had a sold out field of golfers raising \$81,000 for Christ's Haven's mission.



Child Abuse Prevention Month Art Installation

Christ's Haven hosted an event during April's Child Abuse Prevention Month to provide a visual in the community about the impact of child abuse. 543 blue pinwheels were on display in front of the Keller Police Department in honor of the 543 victims of child abuse every month in Tarrant County.



Supervised Independent Living Ribbon Cutting

In July 2022, Christ's Haven For Children opened a newly updated Independent Living Home for young women ages 18-24. Community leaders, donors, and volunteers gathered for the Ribbon Cutting to celebrate the opening.



5th Annual Fashion Show & Brunch

A sold out crowd gathered with their TRIBE to support Christ's Haven while celebrating local boutiques and fashion. \$115,000 was raised to go toward providing Normalcy, Dignity, and Hope in the lives of displaced youth.



Fall Festival & Open House

The annual Open House event had a new element in 2022 with the addition of a Fall Festival. A record-breaking 700+ people attended this fun, family event full of pumpkins, trunk or treaters, and opportunities to tour our neighborhood of homes.

Throughout Karina Nascimento's childhood, she lived in a lot of places with a lot of different people. From her native Brazil to Texas, many years included abuse and neglect. It was when she came to live at Christ's Haven in 1989 that she finally felt safe.

She was in survival mode many of her early years filled with fear and anxiety. So when she came to Christ's Haven, the immediate sense of family and acceptance was life changing.

Karina lived at Christ's Haven for three years until she was 17 years old. As she navigated the teen years, her houseparents, Judy & Ron Parish, helped create opportunities for her by encouraging her to try out for cheerleader, run on the track team, and find a part-time job she enjoyed. That would later prove to be a turning point in her life.

"They gave me stability, security, and love," Karina said.

At her part-time job at the local YMCA, her supervisor said she could use the exercise room to work out if she wanted. Exercising became a refuge for Karina. She knows now that exercise played a significant role in helping her body deal with trauma, depression, and anxiety.

"Judy would take me to the gym and wait in the parking lot for me to do my workout. The gym became a big part of my life. It gave me a sense of security and power that I never had before," Karina said.

That initial introduction to exercise would take her down a path of lifelong fitness and wellness. And even more unique and impressive, a path of competitive bodybuilding where she would go on to win numerous prestigious awards and titles from the International Fitness and Body Federation.

In 2022 she was married, retired, living in Florida, mom to three teenagers of her own, and approaching her 50th birthday. She wanted to celebrate how far she had come in her life and do something big. She brought her friends and family together to celebrate and raise funds for Christ's Haven. 47 friends collectively raised \$10,390.

"I know Christ's Haven gave me something special. What I took with me all of those years ago when I left Christ's Haven was that I was loved. I was worthy. I'm so glad I can give back in some way to the children living there now."

BOARD MEMBER'S LEGACY HONORED WITH "THE ICE HOUSE"

As Sondra Isom visited Christ's Haven after the death of her husband and Christ's Haven Board member, David, she felt compelled to do something to honor his legacy.

"After he first volunteered at Christ's Haven years ago with BNSF, God gave him a heart for the kids living there. He saw the authenticity of the organization and that it wasn't just a false pretense. The organization was living out its mission and following through helping kids have hope."

With an extensive career in the railroad industry and as AVP of Labor Relations for BNSF, David would continue that heart for the Christ's Haven mission by bringing his professional expertise to the Board of Directors and helping guide the organization.

"There are some people who come into your life and immediately make a mark. David was one of those people for me," said Christ's Haven CEO, Cassie McQuitty. "From the moment I met David, I knew there was something different about him. He was thoughtful about every decision as a board member and wanted, more than anything, to serve our kids well."

David passed away from cancer in April 2022, with Sondra by his side throughout. "When you love someone, their vision becomes your vision. Because of his love for Christ's Haven, I love Christ's Haven and knew this had to be how we honored his legacy,"

When she saw that the old Gym was sitting unused, that is when things came together as she talked with Cassie about the organization's needs. The result was a plan to update and refinish the Gym, which will be used by Christ's Haven youth and also available for community events.

The extra touch that warmed Sondra's heart the most was adding an Exercise Room to the back of the Gym that would be exclusively for Christ's Haven staff, teens, and young adults.

"David prided himself in creating efficient work teams. He would want the Christ's Haven staff to have a place for stress relief and self care," she said. "The Ice House" was born from there. Growing up, David always loved participating in team sports. He got the nickname "Ice" in high school, and it stuck with him.

Renovation of "The Ice House" Gym and Exercise Room is expected to be complete the summer of 2023.

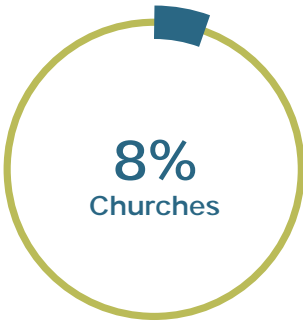

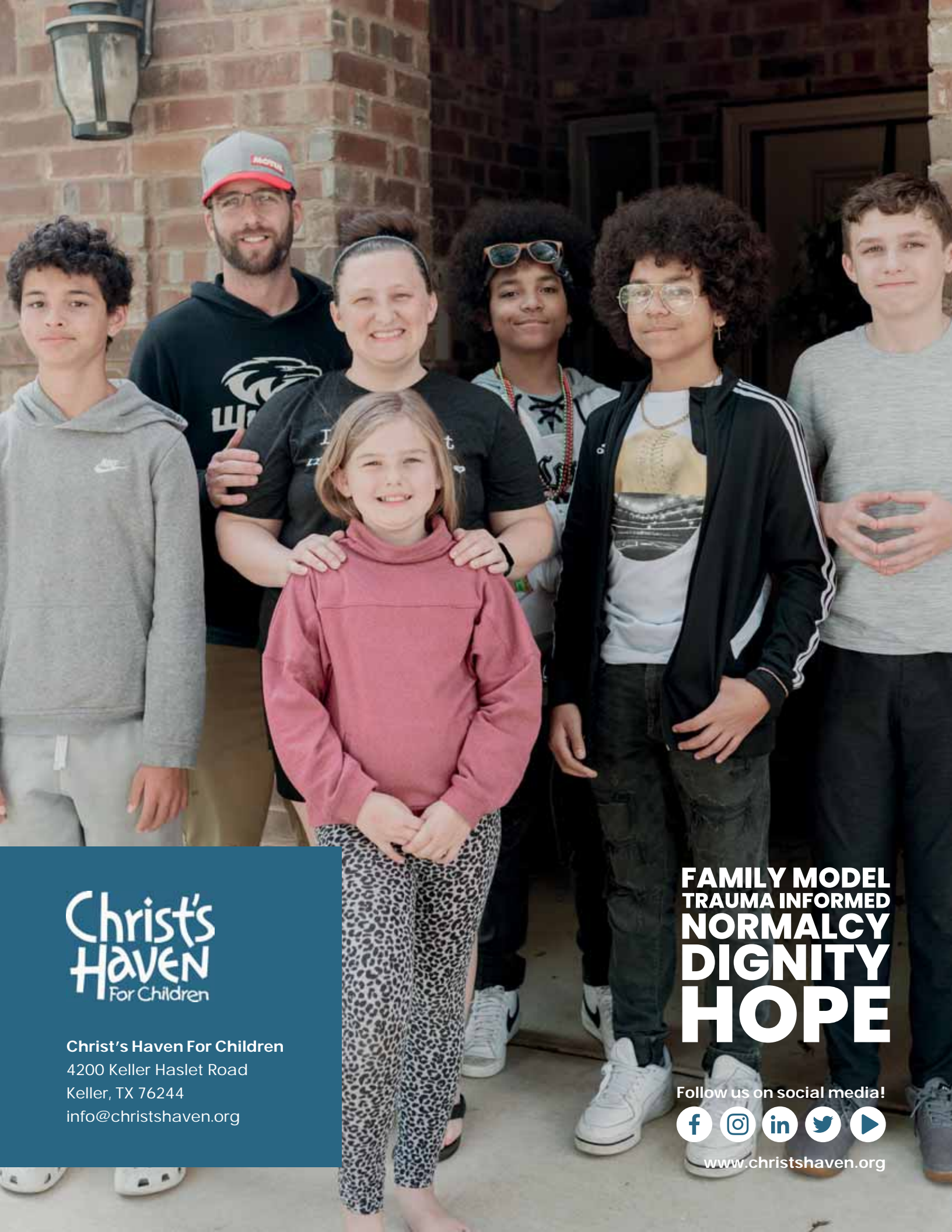
